


Group safety performance – Employees

Fatalities, Days Away From Work Injuries, High-consequence Injuries and Work-related Ill Health



1. The system of rules applied in recording and reporting accident statistics complies with the International Labour Organization (ILO) Code of Practice on Recording and Notification of Occupational Accidents and Diseases.
2. Refers to the number of fatalities as a result of work-related injury.
3. Refers to the number of personnel who sustain a work-related injury and are unfit to perform any work on any day after the occurrence of the injury. "Any day" is any calendar day which includes rest days, weekend days, leave days, public holidays or days after ceasing employment. It does not include the day the injury incident occurred. "Days Away From Work Injuries" excludes fatalities which were included in "Lost Time Injury".
4. Refers to the number of personnel who sustain life-threatening or life-altering work-related injury. It is a subset of Days Away From Work Injuries.
5. Includes the diseases listed in the ILO List of Occupational Diseases, work-related mental illnesses and work-related disorders.
